



Kata Issari, M.S.W., has worked to end violence gender-based violence for close to 35 years. She has worked as an advocate, therapist, fundraiser, clinical supervisor and administrator for grassroots, campus, local and national sexual assault and domestic violence organizations. Originally from Iran, Kata immigrated to the U.S. as a child. Kata and her family recently moved to Seattle, Washington from Honolulu, Hawai'i where they lived for over 19 years. Kata currently serves as the Executive Director of Praxis International, a technical assistance and training organization.

Kata is a founding member of INCITE! Women of Color Against Violence. She has also served as a board member of the National Coalition Against Sexual Assault, Advocates for Abused and Battered Lesbians (now the Northwest Network of Bisexual, Transgendered, Lesbian and Gay Survivors of Abuse) and the Women's Funding Alliance in Seattle.

While in Hawai'i, Kata served as the Program Director of Parents And Children Together's (PACT) Family Peace Center, a comprehensive domestic violence program serving survivors, batterers and children exposed to domestic violence. Kata later served as the Executive Director, Hawai'i Region, of the Joyful Heart Foundation where she provided local and national leadership on Joyful Heart's programming to address sexual assault, domestic violence and child abuse through policy, education, and intervention.
